



In a proactive effort to slow the spread of COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Governor Inslee issued Proclamation 20-07 prohibiting gatherings of 250 people or more for social, spiritual and recreational activities. On March 23 Governor Inslee extended the stay at home directive and requested Washingtonians stay at home except for conducting necessary business, such as grocery shopping, going to the pharmacy, or a doctor's appointment. He also strengthened prohibitions and prohibited any social, spiritual or recreational gatherings. On April 2, 2020 Governor Inslee extended the stay at home order through May 4, 2020.

In light of the serious health concerns that coronavirus poses to the Lake Stevens community, the City is continuing the proactive approach of cancelling all nonessential public meetings until such time as the stay at home order is lifted. This applies to all regularly scheduled Board and Commission meetings.

City Council meetings will be held remotely for the purpose of conducting routine and necessary business or business directly related to COVID-19, as directed by the Governor. Council meetings will be accessible to the public either by direct internet link or telephone access utilizing the Zoom program.

Unless deemed necessary and routine, or related to COVID-19, all Board and Commission meetings are cancelled until such time as the stay at home order is lifted.
